BRIEF HISTORY

A pioneering work was envisaged by the founding fathers of Kukke Shri Subrahmanyeshwara College when they laid the foundation for the college in the year 1983. Till then there were no colleges in the vicinity offering higher education. The starting of the college opened opportunities to rural students of this region to pursue higher education. Since then the college has made rapid progress both in curricular and co-curricular activities.

Historically Kukke Subrahmanya was called Kukke Pattana. It was a flourishing town. Subrahmanya received worldwide popularity due to the temple situated close to the foothills of ever green Western Ghats. Today it is a noted centre of pilgrimage.

The college is managed by K. S. S. Temple. The temple administration comes directly under the control of Govt. of Karnataka. The College is affiliated to Mangalore University and it is recognised by the UGC under 2(f) and 12(b). The College offers BA, B.Com and BBA courses.

COLLEGE EMBLEM



The emblem of the institution represents our vision. This emblem firmly believes that knowledge, which is a perennial flow, is blest by divine force.

The Sanskrit saying ಜ್ಞಾನಮೇವ ಜೀವನಂ (knowledge is life) is the motto of our institution. It is enshrined in the scroll at the base of the emblem. Above this, two books symbolize the pursuit of knowledge and two twigs are branches of knowledge drawing sustenance from the books ultimately culminating as buds. Thus the sweet fragrance, which emanates from the buds, is experienced by the society.

The middle portion of the emblem symbolizes the heart of the institution. Here the flowing stream is like flowing knowledge that leads to wisdom. The hilltops and rising sun in the backdrop of the river symbolize the geographical location of the college. The name of the college is enclosed between two layers, which encircle the middle portion of the emblem.

The top of the emblem depicts hooded Adishesha, the presiding deity of Subrahmanya Temple symbolizing divine grace and sanctity of knowledge.

Thus, our college emblem stands for sustained growth in harmony with intellect and knowledge with divine blessing.

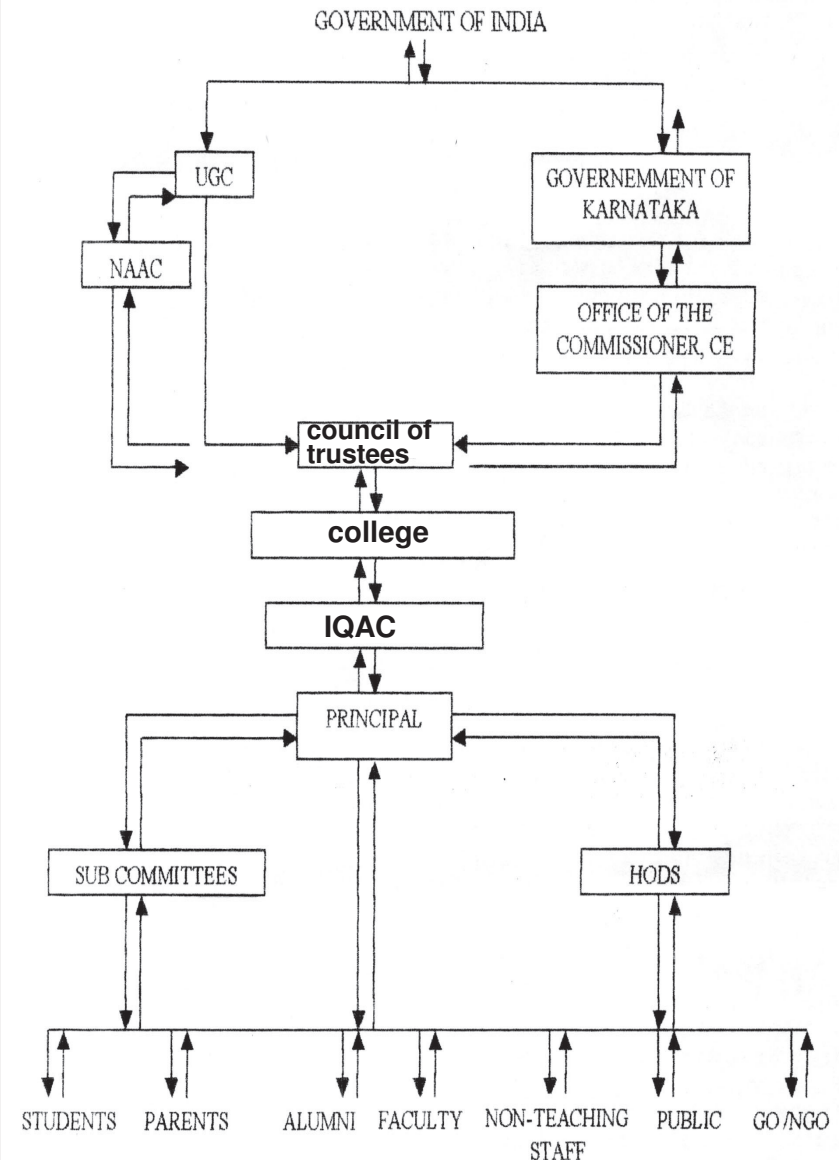

REGULATIONS GOVERNING NEP AND CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Each course shall carry certain number of credits. Credits normally represent the weightage of a course and decide function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, maximum marks etc. In the proposed programmes in general, 2 hours of instructions per week in a semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a semester. On this basis, a three-year degree programme will have a maximum of 100 credits. The other features of the Credit Based Semester Scheme are:

- The degree programmes are structured on semester basis.
- The relative importance of subjects of study and activities are quantified in terms of credits and also their overall relative importance.
- The subjects of study include foundation courses, general studies and interdisciplinary subjects.
- The programme permits horizontal mobility in course selections.
- The students are required to take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and their participation is compulsory as a part of the credit based system.
- The curricula and question papers are unitized.
- The declaration of results is based on the aggregated percentage of marks obtained as well as on Grade Point Average earned.

Duration of the Programmes

The duration of Bachelor Degree programmes shall extend over six semesters (three academic years) of 16 weeks each.

National Education Policy 2020 (NEP)

National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) has marked an epochal development in the educational landscape of India. The policy envisions a student centred education system compatible to transform India to a vibrant knowledge society.

Remarkably, the thrust area of the new education policy is to make the system of education well resourced and multidisciplinary by the consolidation of multiple educational institutions and disciplininess. The proposed creative combination of study and multiple entry and exit makes the system highly flexible and accessible. The traditional rigidity of the formal system and standalone institutions will be replaced with high-quality liberal education that provides an optimal learning environment and multidisciplinary education that provides adequate provision for student mobility.

Internal Assessment

The internal assessment marks shall be based on two tests and one assignment. The test shall be of 1 hour duration to be held during the semester. The average of the three shall be taken as the internal assessment marks.

Registration for Examinations

A candidate shall register for all the papers of a semester when he / she appears for the examination of that semester for the first time.

Conduct of Examinations

There shall be Theory examinations at the end of each semester, ordinarily during October / November for odd semester and during April / May for even semesters, as prescribed in the Scheme of Examinations.

Minimum for a Pass

No candidate shall be declared to have passed the Semester Examination as the case may be under Group I / Group II / Group III (except in Co- and Extra curricular activities unless he / she obtains not less than 35% marks in written examination and 35% marks in the aggregate of written examination and internal assessment put together in each of the subjects.

If a candidate fails in any subject, he / she shall appear for that subject only at any subsequent regular examination, within the maximum period prescribed for completing the programme. He / she must obtain the minimum marks for a pass in that subject as stated above.

Carry Over

A candidate who fails in a lower semester examination may go to the higher semester till final semester.

Classification of successful candidates

The results of successful candidates at the end of VI semester shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the six semesters and the aggregate Grade Point Average (GPA).

Declaration of Class is on the basis of percentage of Aggregate Marks

First Class with Distinction	70% and above
First Class	60% and above but less than 70%
High Second Class	55% and above but less than 60%
Second Class	50% and above but less than 55%

Each semester result shall also be declared in terms of grades. An eight point grading system, which is based on the actual absolute marks scored and alpha-sign grade as described below shall be adopted.

- The candidates who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt in three years are eligible for ranks provided they secure 60% and above marks or at least an A grade.

- The results of the candidates who have passed the VI semester examination but not passed the lower semester examinations shall be declared as NCL (Not Completed Lower semester examinations). Such candidates shall be eligible for the degree only after the completion of all previous semester examinations. A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible for only class and not for ranking

Rules and Regulation Related to Conduct and Behaviour

1. The college lays utmost stress on the formation of sound character and conduct. Violation of the same will be taken seriously.
2. A Student has to seek permission of the principal before absenting from internal assessment examination. Only on medical ground permission can be given for re - test. In such cases proper medical certificate should be submitted.
3. Good conduct and sufficient percentage of attendance are the requirements to appear for University examination.
4. Willful damage of property, books, furniture, water, and electricity installation will be fined. Such loss/ damage will have to be made good by the student concerned or by all the students of the class concerned as the case may be. The decision of the Principal is final in these matters.
5. Use of tobacco, alcohol and drugs in any form is forbidden. Students violating these rules are liable to face severe punishment.
6. Maintain cleanliness inside as well as outside the classroom.
7. No student of the college shall be a member of any organization, which will harm the interest of the institution and retard studies.
8. Irregularity in attendance, absenteeism, deliberate argument with lecturers, indiscipline, insubordination are liable for punishment.
9. Acts of indiscipline will be punished. Punishment may be in the form of fine, cancellation of scholarship or dismissal of the student. The principal may even refuse to give conduct / character certificate or may give an "Unsatisfactory conduct" certificate.
10. The rules pertaining to acts of indiscipline prescribed by the University will be displayed in the notice board from time to time.
11. Every student is given an identity card. It will have the photograph of the student. It will be attested by the principal. Identity card should be produced in the library, examination hall and in the office whenever authorities demand.
12. Students shall not invite any outsider to any college function without the prior permission of the principal.
13. Mobile phones should not be brought to the college as per University rules.
14. Scholarships and fee concessions are available to students according to Government rules. All scholarships and fee concessions are subject to satisfactory progress, conduct and attendance.
15. Loitering in the corridor/ squatting on the compound wall is forbidden.
16. Students who drive vehicle should possess valid driving licence & insurance. Avoid the use of noisy silencers in your vehicles.
17. As per section 116 of Karnataka Education Act ragging is prohibited.
18. It is mandatory to follow the **dress code** as prescribed by the college.

Subject: Revised procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit.

Dear Madam/Sir,

As you are aware, in pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 8.5.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the UGC notified "Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009" and in compliance of the 2nd Amendment in UGC Regulations, it is compulsory for each student and his/her parent/Guardian to submit an online undertaking each academic year at either of the two designated web sites, namely, www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org.

As part of UGC's initiative towards reduction of compliance burden of its stakeholders, UGC has revised the procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit.

The revised procedure is as follows:

Step 1: A student will submit his/her details on the same web sites (www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org) as before; read and confirm that he/she and his/her parents/Guardians have read and understood the regulations on curbing the menace of ragging. He/She will confirm & agree that he/she will not engage in ragging in any form. (Step 1 is the same like before).

Step 2: The student will receive an E MAIL with his/her registration number and a web link. The student will forward the link to the E mail of the Nodal officer in his/her university/college. (Please note that the student will not receive pdf affidavits and he/she is not required to print & sign it as used to be the case earlier).

Step 3: The Nodal Officer in the university/college can click on the link of any forwarded e mails that he/she will receive from any student of his/her college to get the list of those students who have submitted Anti Ragging Affidavits/Undertakings in his/her college. The list will be updated every 24 hours.
