

BRIEF HISTORY

A pioneering work was envisaged by the founding fathers of Kukke Shri Subrahmanyeswara College when they laid the foundation for the college in the year 1983. Till then there were no colleges in the vicinity offering higher education. The starting of the college opened opportunities to rural students of this region to pursue higher education. Since then the college has made rapid progress both in curricular and co-curricular activities.

Historically Kukke Subrahmanya was called Kukke Pattana. It is a flourishing town. Subrahmanya received worldwide popularity due to the temple situated close to the foothills of ever green Western Ghats. Today it is a noted centre of pilgrimage.

The college is managed by K. S. S. Temple. The temple administration comes directly under the control of Govt. of Karnataka. The College is affiliated to Mangalore University and it is recognised by the UGC under 2(f) and 12(b). The College offers BA, B.Com, and BBA Programmes.

COLLEGE EMBLEM



The emblem of the institution represents our vision. This emblem firmly believes that knowledge, which is a perennial flow, is blessed by divine force.

The Sanskrit saying ಜ್ಞಾನಮೇವ ಜೀವನಂ (knowledge is life) is the motto of our institution. It is enshrined in the scroll at the base of the emblem. Above this, two books symbolize the pursuit of knowledge and two twigs are branches of knowledge drawing sustenance from the books ultimately culminating as buds. Thus, the sweet fragrance, which emanates from the buds, is experienced by the society.

The middle portion of the emblem symbolizes the heart of the institution. Here the flowing stream is like flowing knowledge that leads to wisdom. The hilltops and rising sun in the backdrop of the river symbolize the geographical location of the college. The name of the college is enclosed between two layers, which encircle the middle portion of the emblem.

The top of the emblem depicts hooded Adishesha, the presiding deity of Subrahmanya temple symbolizing divine grace and sanctity of knowledge.

Thus, our college emblem stands for sustained growth in harmony with intellect and knowledge with divine blessing.

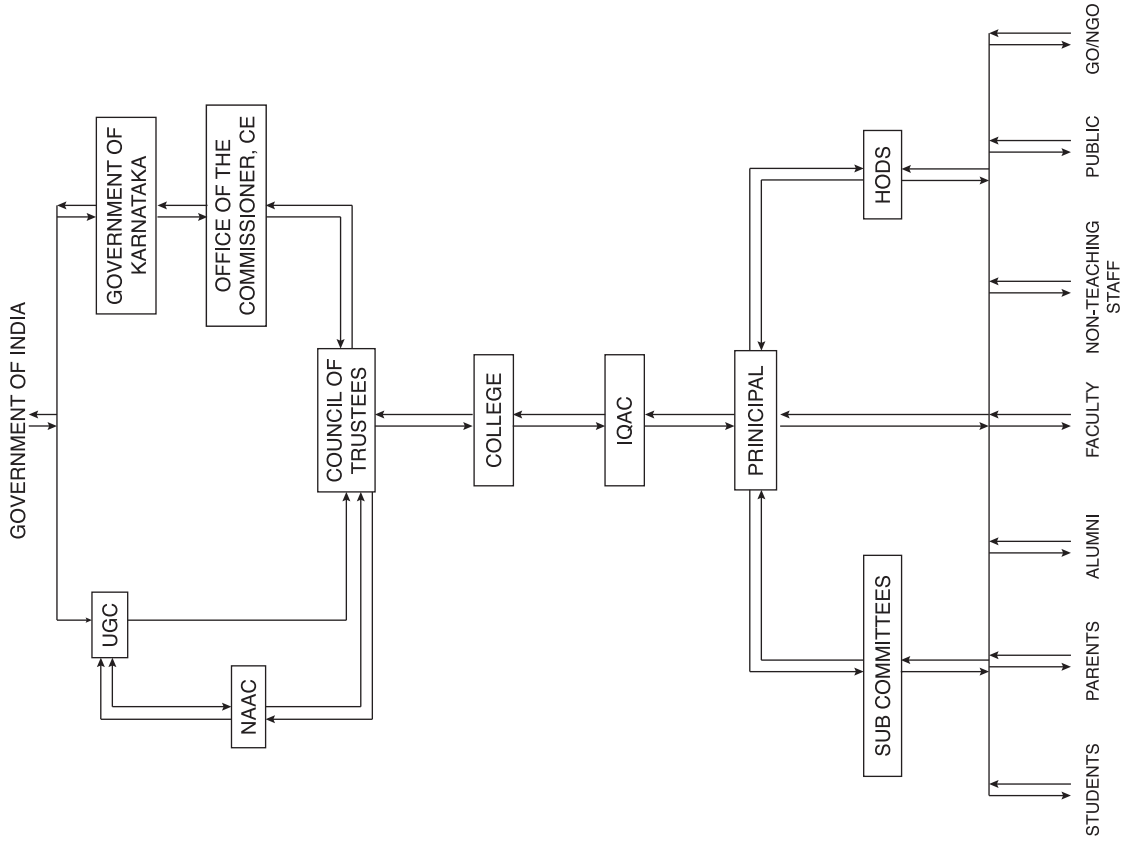

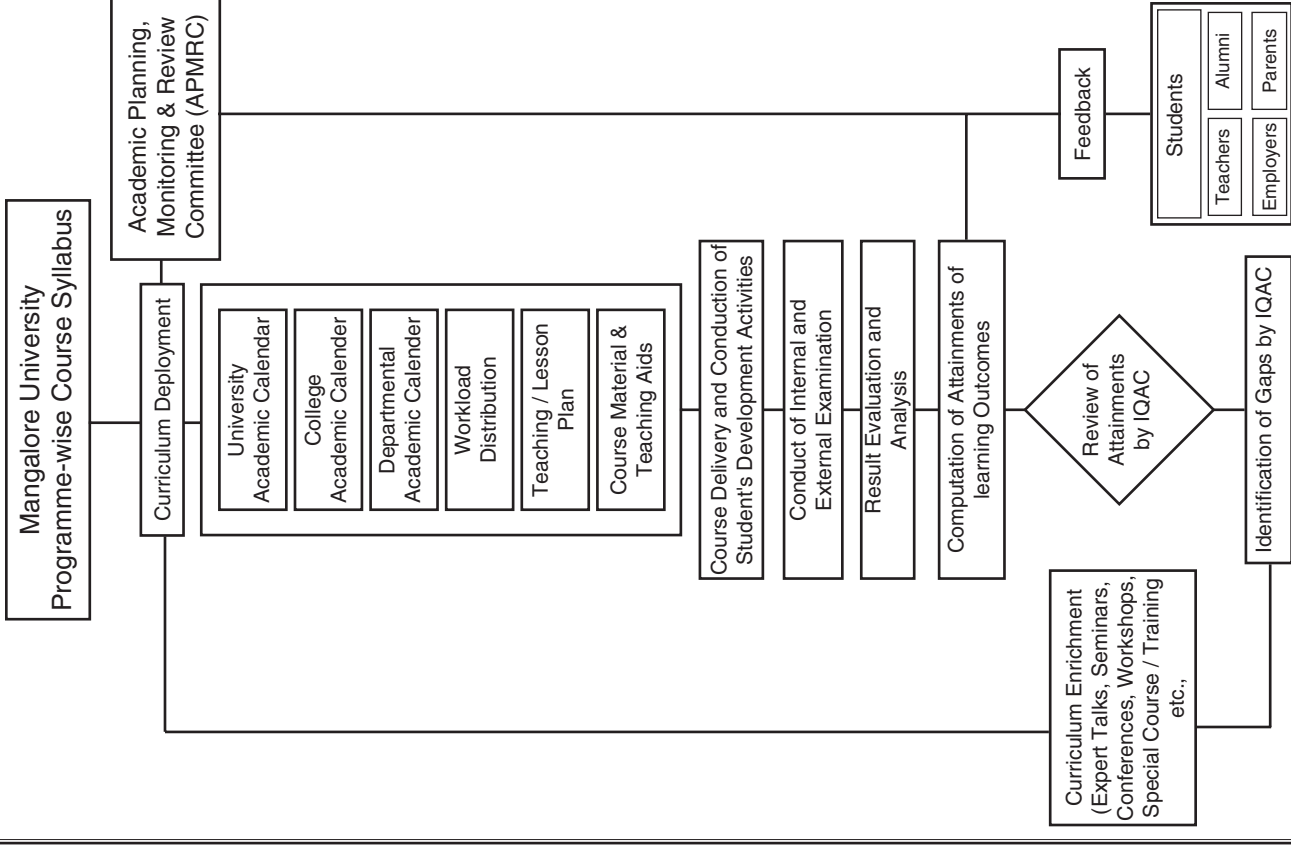

Internal Assessment

The internal assessment marks shall be based on two tests, one assignment and one presentation.

Registration for Examinations

A candidate shall register for all the papers of a semester when he / she appears for the examination of that semester for the first time.

Conduct of Examinations

There shall be Theory examinations at the end of each semester, ordinarily during December / January for odd semester and during June / July for even semesters, as prescribed in the Scheme of Examinations.

Minimum for a Pass

Minimum pass marks is 40%. If a candidate fails in any subject, he / she shall appear for that subject only at any subsequent regular examination, within the maximum period prescribed for completing the programme. He / she must obtain the minimum marks for a pass in that subject as stated above.

Carry Over

A candidate who fails in a lower semester examination may go to the higher semester till final semester.

Classification of successful candidates

The results of successful candidates at the end of VI semester shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the six semesters and the aggregate Grade Point Average (GPA).

Declaration of Class is on the basis of percentage of Aggregate Marks

TEACHING, LEARNING & EVALUATION

Faculty take active interest in teaching. Apart from lecturing webinars, seminars, group discussions, tutorials, project works, on site visits are adapted. Using Audio-Visual aid learning is made more interesting.

Progressive evaluation of students' learning & expected objective are carried out through periodic tests, mid - semester & Preliminary examination. Bridge Course, Remedial & Enrichment programmes are conducted to address specific needs of the students.

RESEARCH

To address research culture, the college has adapted a very comprehensive policy. The college has implemented short term and long term research policies.

Every second / final year student takes part in short term research on pre - decided topics under the guidance of a teacher. The objective is to let the students know research steps and project writing protocol. This instills spirit of inquiry & scientific temperament.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

- Silence must be observed in the library at all times.
- Students are prohibited from carrying edible items to the library.
- Students must behave in a reasonable and seemly manner in the library and must not damage library property or disturb other readers.
- Library membership is compulsory for all students.
- Books are issued to the students only against the borrower's ticket.
- A student who fails to return the book within the due date shall pay an overdue charge.
- The book once borrowed can be renewed on production of the book at the counter before the expiry of the due date. However renewal requests are not honored if that particular book is demanded by other students.
- Students have to sign in the student signature register whenever they visit the library.
- Students have to examine the book thoroughly before borrowing, to know whether pages, maps, charts etc., are intact and in case the above are missing, it should be immediately brought to the notice of the library staff.
- Students will take good care of the books taken out. Any damage will be dealt with a fine.
- Library cards are not transferable.
- Students should return library books along with their library cards to the library and obtain No Due Certificate before receiving admission tickets for the examinations.
- College provides books to alumni and public on membership.



RULES AND REGULATION RELATED TO CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

1. The college lays utmost stress on the formation of sound character and conduct. Violation of the same will be taken seriously.
2. A Student has to seek permission of the principal before absenting from internal assessment examination. Only on medical ground permission can be given for re - test. In such cases proper medical certificate should be submitted.
3. Good conduct and sufficient percentage of attendance are the requirements to appear for University examination.
4. Willful damage of property, books, furniture, water, and electricity installation will be fined. Such loss/ damage will have to be made good by the student concerned or by all the students of the class concerned as the case may be. The decision of the Principal is final in these matters.
5. Use of tobacco, alcohol and drugs in any form is forbidden. Students violating these rules are liable to face severe punishment.
6. Maintain cleanliness inside as well as outside the classroom.
7. No student of the college shall be a member of any organization, which will harm the interest of the institution and retard studies.
8. Irregularity in attendance, absenteeism, deliberate argument with lecturers, indiscipline, insubordination are liable for punishment.
9. Acts of indiscipline will be punished. Punishment may be in the form of fine, cancellation of scholarship or dismissal of the student. The principal may even refuse to give conduct / character certificate or may give an "Unsatisfactory Conduct" certificate.
10. The rules pertaining to acts of indiscipline prescribed by the University will be displayed in the notice board from time to time.

11. Every student is given an identity card. It will have the photograph of the student. It will be attested by the principal. Identity card should be produced in the library, examination hall and in the office whenever authorities demand.
12. Students shall not invite any outsider to any college function without the prior permission of the principal.
13. Mobile phones should not be brought to the college as per University rules.
14. Scholarships and fee concessions are available to students according to Government rules. All scholarships and fee concessions are subject to satisfactory progress, conduct and attendance.
15. Loitering in the corridor/ squatting on the compound wall is forbidden.
16. Students who drive vehicle should possess valid driving licence & insurance. Avoid the use of noisy silencers in your vehicles.
17. As per section 116 of Karnataka Education Act ragging is prohibited.
18. It is mandatory to follow the dress code as prescribed by the college.

Dear Madam/Sir,

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the UGC notified "Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". The Regulations are available on the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in & www.anti-ragging.in.

It is once again brought to your kind notice that ragging is a criminal offence and UGC has framed regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. These regulations are mandatory and all institutions are required to take necessary steps for its implementation in toto including the monitoring mechanism. Any violation of these regulations will be viewed seriously. If any institution fails to take adequate steps to prevent ragging or does not act in accordance with these Regulations or fails to punish perpetrators of incidents of ragging suitably, it will attract punitive action against itself by the UGC.

You are requested to step up anti-ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through various mediums; constitution of Anti-Ragging committee and Anti-Ragging squad, setting up of Anti-Ragging Cell, installing CCTV cameras at vital points, Anti-Ragging workshops and seminar, updating all websites with nodal officers' complete details, alarm bells etc. Regular interaction and counselling with the students, identification of trouble-triggers and mention of Anti-Ragging warning in the institution's E-prospectus and E-information booklets/brochures must be ensured. Surprise inspections of hostels, students' accommodation, canteens, rest cum recreational rooms, toilets, bus-stands must be carried out & Anti-Ragging posters must be displayed at all prominent places like Admission Centre, Departments, Library, Canteen, Hostel, Common facilities etc. These posters are available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in. The size of posters should be 8x6 feet. Any other measure which would auger well in preventing/quelling ragging and any uncalled for behaviour/incident must be undertaken.
